Theme: Family Traditions!

The color: Brown (mix of primary colors **Yellow+Blue+Red+White**)

Literacy: Children will practice and learn to identify letters **T, F, B** visually and by sounds.

Concepts full-hungry, soft-hard, far-near. English language vocabulary will include words related to the Thanksgiving day such as pilgrims, Indians, turkey, corn, cranberry, potato, pumpkin, pie etc.

Math: Children will learn to count by **3** and **4**, and compare objects by size, length, and height with related concepts of "**tall-short**", "**long-short**". Children will have activities with the shapes of **square, triangle, rectangle**.

Science: We will learn **parts of tree**: roots, trunk, branches, and leaves. Students will gain more knowledge about **forest birds** such as turkey, owl, red cardinal, crow, chickadee, sparrow; learn about birds' features: wings, beaks, feathers) and travel with the birds around the world to find warm weather.

Social Studies: Students will get a small portion of the American history and the origin of the Thanksgiving day. They will learn who pilgrims and Indians were. We are planning to create a historical atmosphere for Thanksgiving celebration by making pilgrims' and Indians' hats & headdresses. Moreover, we will determine where different food come from and how it look like when it is cooked. Children and their families will have an opportunity to share a family recipe for a holiday dinner.

Arts & Craft: We will develop fine-motor skills and work with scissors and natural materials such as rice, pasta, and beans to create art projects and decorations for Thanksgiving Day.
